The Blue Era Sustainable Blue Economy Masters Program is a collaborative effort between universities in Egypt, Tunisia, Jordan, France, Italy, and Greece. This exciting new program is designed to address the needs of local economies in the southern Mediterranean by providing students with the knowledge and skills they need to pursue careers in this important field.

Our ultimate objective is to use ocean resources on sustainable manner for local arowth needs, improved economic livelihoods, entrepreneurship to local needs and generating employment (empowerment of youngs) while preserving the health of ocean ecosystems.

Outcomes of the UPGRADE project:

Our main objective is the establishment of a new master's degree program for sustainable blue economy in the south Mediterranean region (Region 3 countries: Tunisia, Egypt and Jordan).

Expected outcomes are of highly qualified graduates in fields of sustainable blue economy. Thanks to the **BLUE-ERA** consortium for their significant contribution in the development of exchanges of knowledge, expertise and good practice tools for professional and entrepreneurial integration, employability and professionalization of students will be promoted. The sustainability of the

proposed plan will guarantee the continuation of the master's program far beyond the end of the project. In addition, the interconnection between laboratories and future research collaborations will strengthen the research capacity in the field of blue economy, including the establishment of co-supervised postgraduates and PhD fellows..

BLUE ERA SECOND CONSORTIUM MEETING - ADVANCING SUSTAINABLE BLUE ECONOMY EDUCATION - FEB 18

The Second Consortium Meeting of the BLUE ERA Project was successfully held at the University of Palermo, Italy, from January 27-29, 2025. This meeting brought together representatives from partner universities, research institutions, and industry stakeholders to assess project progress and plan the next phases of implementation.

One of the most significant discussions centred on the establishment of the new MSc in Sustainable Blue Economy, which is being developed across six universities in Tunisia, Egypt, and Jordan. Partners provided updates on the accreditation process with the Supreme Council of Universities in each country and discussed the procurement of new equipment that will enhance research and training capabilities for students.

A major milestone was achieved as universities in Tunisia, Egypt, and Jordan confirmed their intention to officially launch the MSc in September 2025, marking the first intake of students into this pioneering program. This initiative will equip future professionals with the skills and knowledge needed to drive sustainable development in the marine and coastal sectors, strengthening regional and international cooperation in the blue economy.

Beyond strategic discussions, the meeting also facilitated knowledge exchange, networking, and engagement with industrial and scientific institutions, reinforcing the collaborative spirit of the BLUE ERA Project.











AASTMT, AU, AND ULCO SIGN MOUS UNDER BLUE ERA AT FRANCO-EGYPTIAN FORUM - APRIL 9

The Arab Academy for Science, Technology and Maritime Transport (AASTMT) and Alexandria University (AU) participated in the Franco-Egyptian Higher Education and Research Forum (Cairo, April 7–8, 2025), coinciding with French President Emmanuel Macron's visit. Organized by the French Embassy and Egypt's Ministry of Higher Education, the event fostered academic and scientific cooperation.

AASTMT President Prof. Dr. Ismail Abdel Ghafar and AU President Prof. Dr. Abdelaziz Konsowa signed MoUs with ULCO (France), represented by Prof. Dr. Edmond Abi-Aad, under the EUfunded BLUE ERA project. The agreements focus on:

- Joint postgraduate programs
- Student/faculty exchanges
- Research in maritime tech, marine biotech, and digital innovation

The signing was attended by Egypt's Minister of Higher Education Dr. Ayman Ashour, France's Minister Philippe Baptiste, and SCU Secretary-General Prof. Dr. Mostafa Refaat. A closing ceremony at Cairo University, with President





Macron present, highlighted enduring Egypt-France academic ties.

This collaboration strengthens blue economy and sustainable coastal development through transnational education and research.
